INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Ensure that you are working on a flat and solid surface of the same (or larger) size as the gauge cluster front cover. This will prevent warping or distortion that can cause cracking or damage to the cover.
- 2. You will first need to use a hand saw to remove the front tip of cover along the red line below.



We recommend making two different cut lines. Start on either the right or left side and saw to the center of the cover. Remove the blade and then resume sawing from the other side so that the saw lines meet in the middle.



When finished, the front cover should be in two separate pieces. You can discard this piece:



3. Next, thread the blade of the hand saw through the cover like the image below:



4. Cut off the bottom of the piece of the bracket that he saw is threded through. The cover should look like this:



5. Use sandpaper to smooth the face of the areas you removed.



6. Re-use the 3 phillips screws that came with your bike to re-mount the front cover back onto your bike.
